The LIBERATE study may be right for you!

TWENTY million American women of all ages suffer from fecal incontinence, also known as Accidental Bowel Leakage (ABL), and we rarely talk about it. **Atlantic Urogynecology Associates** is conducting a research study on a treatment for women with bowel control problems. The treatment, called the Eclipse™ System, uses a vaginal insert to control passage of stool in the rectum. The insert, which is non-surgical and does not contain drugs or hormones, resides in a similar position as a diaphragm or tampon and can be removed by the patient at any time. Study participation may last approximately 15 months. Some reimbursement is provided to study participants.

ELIGIBILITY:

You may be eligible to participate in the LIBERATE Study if you experience loss of bowel control and meet the following criteria:

- + Are female and at least 19 years old
- + Have a history of accidental bowel leakage for at least 6 months
